



Executive Summary (Apr-2024)



HOTEL ACTIVITY: Occupancy, ADR and RevPAR in the traditional hotel industry remain at high levels and registering increases vs. the previous year. At the sub-destination level, San Jose del Cabo continues to consolidate in 2024 as a more expensive destination than Cabo San Lucas and with the highest growth of all subdestinations vs. 2023. Likewise, RevPAR is at its highest levels since the beginning of this observatory.

- Hotel occupancy in Los Cabos in Apr-2024 registered 75%, or 2pp higher than in Apr-2023. At the subdestination level, Cabo San Lucas recorded 78% (+1pp), San Jose del Cabo, 70% (-1pp), and El Corredor, 74% (+10pp) compared to Apr-2023.
 - The average rate at Los Cabos hotels during Apr-2024 was \$497 USD, 1% less than in Apr-2023. The highest rate is presented in El Corredor (\$711 USD), maintaining its upward trend (+4% vs previous year) and again registering the highest level since the beginning of the observatory; Cabo San Lucas reaches \$340, up 24% vs previous year, while San Jose del Cabo averages \$342 and raises its rate 12% (this increase comes hand in hand with a 19.2% reduction in the supply of available rooms in the subdestination). In Apr-2024 the RevPAR was \$372 USD; 2% higher than in Apr-2023.
- In Apr-2024, the supply of accommodation through online platforms increases 7.4%, reaching 6 thousand. However, occupancy fell 12 pp to 43%.
- In Apr-2024, its average daily rate is \$569 (1.1% less than Apr-2023) and 15% higher than traditional hotels.



TOURIST SATISFACTION: Satisfaction with public safety and the Los Cabos airport return to the high levels they had maintained during 2023 and 2024. However, satisfaction with the destination continues to show a negative trend since the beginning of the year. Meanwhile, the proportion of returning visitors and those traveling as part of a package continue to recover and show increases again.

- In Apr-2024, 60% of tourists rate Los Cabos as "more than expected" (-8pp versus Apr-2023), maintaining a negative trend compared to the first months of 2023. Satisfaction with safety in Los Cabos returns to high levels: 1.2% of tourists had a fair or poor perception (same level as in Apr-2023). Satisfaction with the airport also improves this month, reaching 2.8% with fair or poor perception, however, it drops 7 pp compared to the previous year.
- Returning tourists are up 4pp when compared to the previous year: 39% in Apr-2024; maintaining an upward trend this year.
- Package tourists also continue to improve and maintain a significant growth (+11pp), reaching 31%.



MEETINGS: RFP receipts for group events are up 8 units this month, remaining within the highest levels since a year ago.

• In Apr-2024, 62 RFPs are received (8 less than in Apr-2023).



Executive Summary (Apr-2024)



AIR ACTIVITY: The domestic market remains at high levels, although it continues to show decreases this month. U.S. tourist arrivals also continue to grow, along with a sustained increase in the participation of tourists reporting residency in states such as Washington. Vancouver, meanwhile, accounts for 40% of Canadian passengers, and remains the most important issuing airport in Canada. International tourists on private flights are at their peak since the beginning of the observatory.


- In Apr-2024, 320.8 thousand passengers arrived at Los Cabos airport (down 8.5% vs. Apr-2023).
 - Passengers on domestic flights (108.5 thousand) represent 34% of the total (and decrease 16.8% vs. the previous year). Of these, 38.5% came from CDMX (AICM, TLC and NLU), followed by Guadalajara with 22.1% and TIJ with 21.8%. Tijuana remains the Mexican market with the highest growth, while CDMX continues to lose market share (-8.2pp YoY).
 - Passengers on international flights (212.75 thousand) accounted for 66%, a decrease of 3.6% compared to the previous year. The main airports of origin are Los Angeles (13%, maintaining a decrease in its share), Dallas (11%) and Phoenix (10.7%).
 - Nevertheless, California and Texas continue to be the main U.S. tourism origins for travel to Los Cabos (26% and 14% of the total). These are
 followed by Washington (8%), which continues to increase its share and consolidate its position as the third largest origin of tourism to SJD
 within the USA. The average flight cost from LAX airports has generally been the cheapest option from the U.S. (this month, 38% cheaper
 than average).
 - From Canada, the leading origin this year and maintaining its growth vs 2023 was Vancouver (40%, and +5.2pp vs 2023), followed by Calgary (25.1%), and Toronto (14.3%).
- 86.4% of inbound tourists in SJD, from Jan-Mar-2024 had U.S. residency and 10.5% Canadian. Inbound tourists with U.S. passports rose 5.7% versus Mar-2023 while those from Canada fell 1.9%.
- Tourist arrivals from South and Central America are up 8.3% year-to-date. Germany increased 120%.
- From Jan-Mar 2024, passenger traffic to Los Cabos airport decreased 2.1% compared to the same period in 2023. The domestic market shows a 3.9% accumulated decrease compared to 2023 and Canada a 14.8% decrease.
- A total of 4,477 commercial operations (13% less than in Mar-2023) and 2,023 private operations (+14.7) were recorded at Los Cabos International Airport (SJD).



Additionally, 11.8 thousand international tourists arrived on private flights in Mar-2024 (+15.1% vs. Mar-2023). This is the highest level recorded since the
beginning of the observatory (presenting a cumulative increase of 19% vs. 2023).

CRUISES AND YACHTS: Cruise ship activity to Los Cabos in Mar-2024 continues to record steep declines in both vessels and passengers.

• In Mar-2024, the Cabo San Lucas marina recorded the arrival of 16 cruise ships, a decrease of 16 ships compared to the same period in 2023. These vessels transported a total of 56.3 thousand passengers (-45% vs. Mar-2023).





Percentual change from previous year











Cumulative Passenger Arrivals at Los Cabos airport, U.S. Flights, cumulative Jan-Apr-2024






Cumulative Passenger Arrivals at Los Cabos airport, Canadian Flights, cumulative Jan-Apr-2024









Annual Variation in Tourist Arrivals to Hotels, by Origin. (Oct-2023 to Mar-2024 vs. previous year)



Seat planning for Mexico (May-2024 and beyond)







GLOSSARY



Glossary

- Congress. Non-business-oriented meetings in which large groups of individuals gather, generally to discuss and exchange points of view on a topic of interest. They usually have a duration of several days and simultaneous sessions, as well as a predefined multiannual or annual frequency.
- Convention. Trade or business meetings usually sponsored by a corporation, in which participants represent the same company, corporate group or customer or supplier relationships. Sometimes participation is mandatory and travel expenses are paid by the corporation. Includes those general and formal meetings of a legislative, social or economic body, in order to provide information, deliberate or establish consensus or address policies on the part of the participants, as well as to address business issues around a market, product or brand. They may contain a secondary exhibition component.
- Rooms available. The number of rooms in service. It does not include rooms that are out of service due to repairs or any other cause.
- Tourist destination. The primary destination of a tourist trip that is fundamental to the decision to make the trip. See also main reason for a tourist trip.
- Seasonality. Means that tourist flows tend to concentrate around certain times of the year, repeating this process annually.
- Length of stay. It is the result of dividing the total number of overnight tourists by the number of tourist arrivals per month. The result obtained expresses the number of days of stay of the tourist.
- Events or incentive trips. Incentive travel is a modern management strategy focused on recognizing people who achieved or exceeded objectives commonly related to sales or productivity, targeting participants who demonstrate improved job performance with an extraordinary travel experience.
- Room nights. This is obtained from the daily record of the number of tourists occupying the establishment's rooms, by length of stay (number of nights spent in the establishment) and is classified according to their place of origin, into residents or non-residents.
- Inflation. Continuous and generalized growth in the prices of goods and services sold in an economy. It is the average growth rate from one period to another of the prices of a basket of goods and services.
- Underlying inflation. It is the increase in prices of a subset of the CPI (National Consumer Price Index), which contains the least volatile items. It measures the inflation trend in the medium term. The 283 generic concepts that make up the CPI basket of goods and services are classified or grouped into subsets that respond to particular needs of analysis, among the best-known classifications are by object of expenditure, that which refers to the sector of origin of goods and services, and that of durability of goods and underlying inflation.
- Passenger arrivals. Passengers transported on airline aircraft with established routes and itineraries.
- Tourist arrivals. Corresponds to the number of tourists registered by the establishment during the month.

Glossary

- Nationality of a visitor. That of the country issuing the passport or other identity document, even if they habitually reside in another country.
- Non-Resident. A person whose usual place of residence is outside Mexican territory and who visits Mexico for a period of less than twelve months for any reason (business, vacations and others). Excluded if remuneration is received for the activities carried out in the place visited.
- Hotel occupancy. The occupancy rate of accommodations is a concept based on supply. It is an important indicator for many purposes. It provides information on the differences in utilization among the various types of lodging establishments. It also indicates the seasonal pattern for tourist accommodations.
- RevPAR. RevPAR is the most important metric used in the hotel industry to assess the financial performance of an establishment or chain. It is an abbreviation of Revenue Per Available Room. It always refers to a specific period (weekly, monthly, yearly, etc.). One way to calculate RevPAR is through the formula: RevPAR = It/ΣHt, where It is equal to the total revenue generated by rooms in a period t. and ΣHt is equal to the total number of rooms available in a period t. That is, the rooms of the establishment or chain multiplied by the number of nights in period t minus the unavailable rooms.
- Resident. Individual whose usual environment is in Mexican territory.
- Residence. The place/country where the traveler has stayed for most of the previous year (12 months) or has stayed for a shorter period and expects to return within 12 months to live in that country.
- Average daily rate (commonly referred to as ADR) is a statistical unit that represents the average revenue per occupied room paid in each period. The ADR along with the occupancy of the property are the basis for the financial performance of the property. ADR is calculated by dividing room revenue by the number of rooms sold. House guest rooms (known as house use) and complimentary rooms (known as complementary) should be excluded from the denominator.
- Tourist. Any person traveling away from his or her usual location for a period of less than 12 months and for any reason, except persons engaged in activities that will generate income for them at the travel destination; refugees or migrant workers; diplomats; seasonal or border workers; or tourism employees.
- Visitor. Any person who travels away from his or her usual location for a period of less than 12 months for any reason, except persons who engage in activities that will generate income for them at the travel destination: refugees or migrant workers; diplomats; seasonal or border workers; tourism employees; or persons seeking to establish a new residence or employment.
